





Covid and the imposed social isolation greatly affected the mental health of the children. The abrupt change in the learning environment filled their happy and carefree lives with anxiety and depression. Asian International School with the aim of spreading a little positivity in the lives of the children organised various workshops for **Classes V to VIII** from **26th April to 3rd May, 2021**. These online sessions were conducted keeping a few objectives in mind which solely centered around the emotional and mental upliftment of the child, for example, to apprise the children about the benefits of having a healthy mind and body, to help the children identify their own feelings and emotions in this hard time, to enhance their emotional vocabulary, to help them deal with boredom, loneliness, anxiety and stress, to increase their concentration and focus. **Ms. Sarini Chatterjee, Counsellor** of Asian International School conducted all the sessions. The topics for the sessions were **'Indoor Adventures During Corona Break'** and **'Mindful Awareness'**. The students were apprised about **'Mindfulness meditation'** which guided them to deal with their stress and anxiety, anger and frustration. They got to learn about the feelings that we experience through our body parts when we are angry and then discussed the tricks and tips to deal with it. The calming jar experiment helped the children to calm their brain and body. The session touched upon various important topics like **'How to deal with the conflicts that are taking place with the parents?'** and **'How to deal with boredom, isolation and frustrations, lack of attention, concentration and focus?'**. The counsellor also tried the **Seeing Game**, taught them **Butterfly breath** and even asked them to rate their emotions through the **emotional thermometers**. Both workshops witnessed immense enthusiasm from the children.

After the success of the first counselling sessions, **Ms. Sarini Chatterjee, Counsellor** of AIS conducted another set of counselling workshops for **Classes V to VIII** from **21st June to 24th June, 2021**. The topics for the workshops were **'Gadget Addiction'** and **'Time Management'**. In today's **'digital days'**, toddlers know how to use smartphones before they even start to speak. One of the main objectives of the first workshop was to make the children understand the meaning of gadget addiction and to make them aware about the harmful effects of overusing of gadgets. The school counsellor prepared four activities for them on these topics. **'Questions related to gadget overuse'** and **'pros and cons of using gadgets and reading books'** were also discussed. For **Classes VII and VIII** **'Managing Time'** workshop was held as during COVID-19 pandemic it is important for the pupils to balance between school and work. The aim was to make them understand the importance of time management and to help them prioritize and plan their time accordingly. To make the session fruitful activities such as, **'How long is one minute?'**, **'What did you do yesterday?'**, **'The importance of goal'**, priority and planning in time management were organized by the counsellor. Needless to say, both the workshops were thoroughly enjoyed by the students.

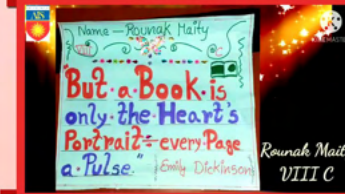
COMMEMORATION OF DR. B. R. AMBEDKAR'S 129th BIRTHDAY

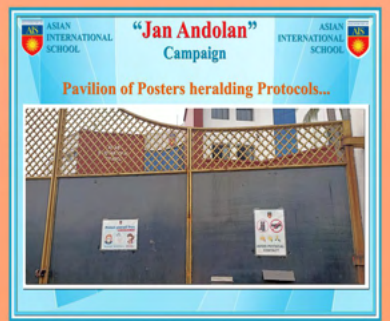
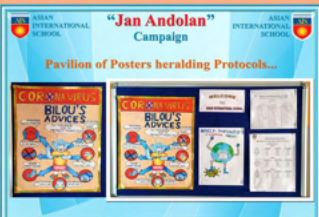
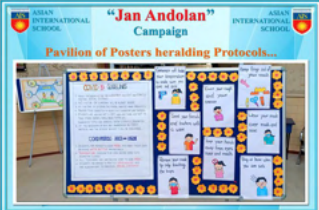
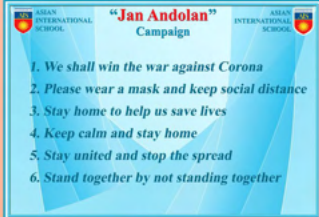
ENGLISH WEEK CELEBRATION

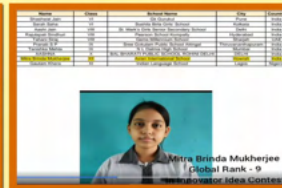

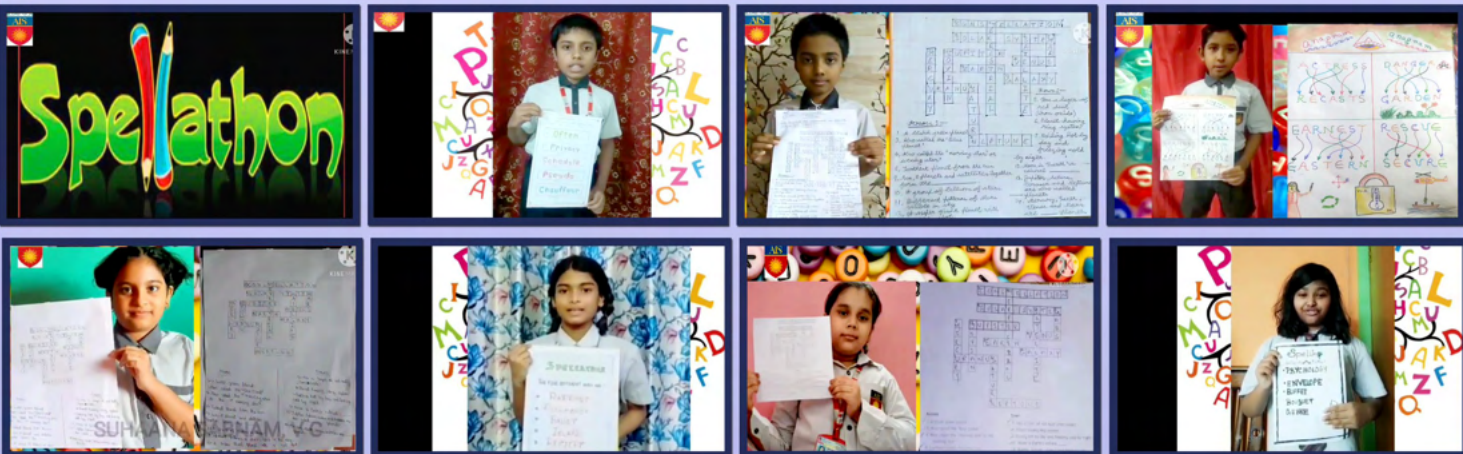
COUNCIL OF SCIENTIFIC & INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH AWARD

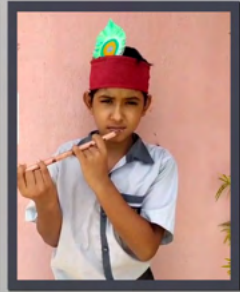
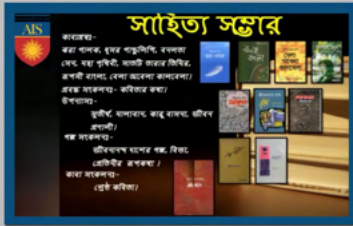
PERSONALITY OF THE MONTH

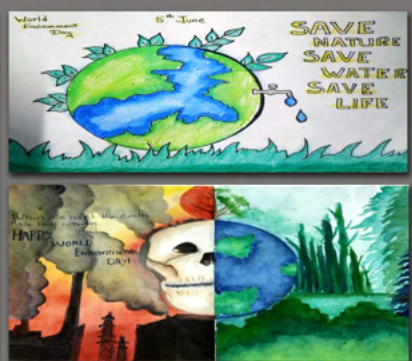
Subhadra Kumari Chauhan

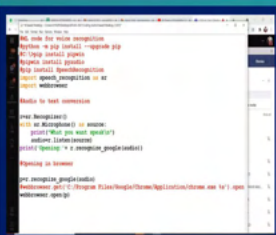
TERRARIUM
