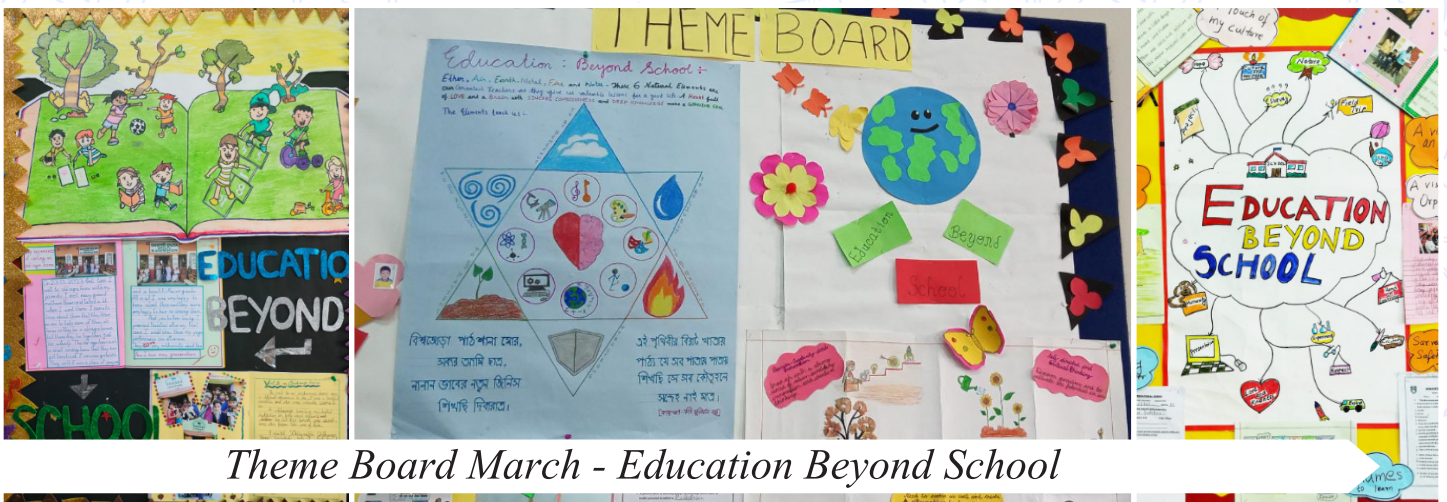

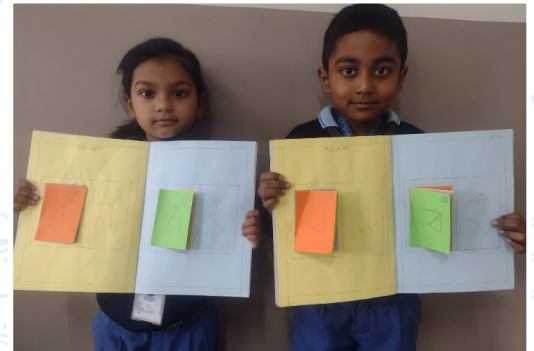

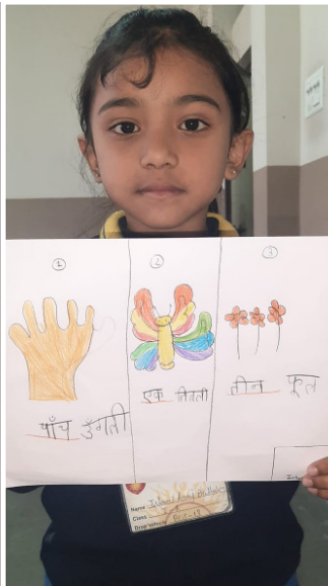
*Shabder Dinlipi:-*

The rapid advancement of technology has made communication easy and accessible. A collaborative project has the ability to track the progress of the communication process. A model is widely used to depict any idea, thought, or concept in a simpler way through diagrams, pictorial representations, etc. This activity assisted the children to delve deeper into the different modes of communication. To delve deep-



er into the 'Various means of communication', the students of class V prepared a 'Model creation on the different modes of communication'. The activity recapitulates the concepts learned in the previous classes. The students used the following items-Pictures of a laptop, radio, TV, newspaper, fax machine, post box, Ice cream sticks, Glue, Sketch pens/ Colourful pens, and 1/4th of a chart paper. The use of visual representations (i.e., photographs, diagrams, models) has been part of social science, and their use makes it possible for the teacher as well as the students to contribute to knowledge formation. The activity helped me to be acquainted with the freedom struggle of the country. The activity was done in the form of a collaborative project which helped to inculcate a sense of belonging for them.

# Insights

## on Co-scholastic Activities



Spring Delight-LKG to I- AIS believes and follows the motto of 'Education for life'. AIS has always integrated fun learning, experiments, and application to help children in their overall growth. As we all know Spring is a season of new growth, change, bright colours, and happiness. It is called the king of all seasons for its natural beauty. The weather is very pleasant and the sky is clear and blue. The spring season brings new life to Mother Earth and makes the environment look delightful. Keeping the season in mind during the month of February, our school has organized some Spring Delight fun activities for the little Asians. The students of the pre-primary section celebrated 'Spring Delight' activities in the school post the completion of the Term-II Assessment. The zeal and fun of the students were distinctly seen in their whole-hearted participation in various activities. The Spring Delight Activities were conducted into 5 segments which were Fun with Science, Fun Activities, Foundation, and Numeracy Skill Activities, Hand-Eye-Leg Coordination Activities, and Thank You Craft. Fun with Science had a number of sub-activities like Change of Shape Activity (inflation of balloon and its shape increases), Hearing Balloon (inflate a balloon and place it next to the kid's ear and tap gently), Change of colour of Flowers (mix colour in two glasses and dip a flower in each), Water has no Shape (water taking the shape of any container, Rain cloud in a Jar (pouring shaving cream over a glass of water and dropping food colour over it), etc. There were many fun activities like games of Tug of War, Passing through the Hole, blowing and Passing the Egg, Passing the Parcel, Movie

the Cups, Throw Balls in the Cups to Score, Pick Paper Balls with a Fork, etc. Hand-Eye-Leg Coordination activities included Musical Chai with Actions, Balance Paper Cups and Paper, Shapes and Colours, Concentration Game (students in pairs need to walk along two differently shaped paths holding hands), etc. Thank You Craft was one such activity wherein the students had hands-on learning while making DIY paper plate-hatching chicks. The chick hatching out of the eggshell was a symbol of a kid who is grateful to his teacher for pulling the latent talent out of him and enabling him to go to the next grade. These activities helped little Asians to learn to understand the environment, explore science with the help of fun activities, and also learn about numeracy through games. Children could relate their knowledge and understanding to real-life objects and situations along with hand-eye-leg coordination. These activities also helped them to develop their fine motor skills, and gross skills making them learn to balance objects, be fit while playing games, share, teamwork, etc.



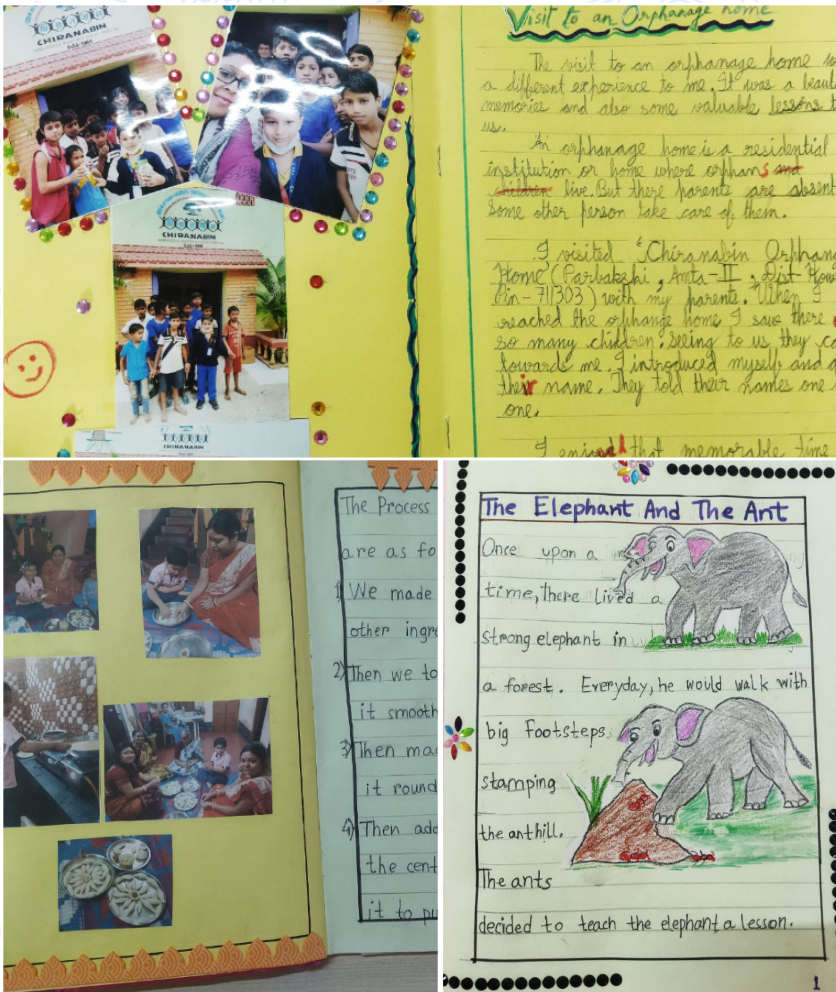

*Learning Beyond Classroom-LKG to V-*  
 Learning is the process of acquiring new understanding, knowledge, behaviors, skills, values, attitudes, and preferences. It is a lifelong process of transforming information and experience into knowledge, skills, and behaviors. Traditionally it is believed that learning takes place in a formal setup. Classroom learning is a traditional mode of learning in which the learning environment is created within the physical walls of a classroom. The entire educational system right from the time a student gets into academics is based on the Classroom learning method. However, teaching and learning experiences that take place outside of the confines of the classroom walls have a range of benefits for both students and instructors. Learning beyond the classroom is a student-centric learning experience that enhances learning and fosters personal and social development. Learning experiences that take place outside the classroom are forms





of experiential learning. These experiences are rooted in the simple principle that “experience is the best teacher.” Our school has organized excursions for the young minds to provide them with an ideal ‘outdoor classroom’ setting that is not within their routine learning experience on the 13th, 16th, and 20th of March respectively. This allowed students to have hands-on experience in experiencing all that they have already learned in the class. Though the excursion visits are meant for fun, they are also meant to provide a structured learning experience in which students can develop their individual talents, interests, and abilities through an experience that allows them to innovate and experiment. Planning for the excursion began with the assessment of students’ interests. The Activity Team of the Primary Section made arrangements for the entire excursion. Consent Forms were filled out by the parents and the tour details were shared through WhatsApp groups. Classes LKG, UKG, and I were taken to the Nehru Children’s Museum. The venue for the excursion of classes II & III was the Railway Museum. The children of classes IV & V had the opportunity to visit Birla Industrial and Technological Museum. This trip to the museums is a part of quality teaching and learning programs because they deliver the teaching content through hands-on experiences. Students experienced activities that were part of the trip and these helped them not only to think out of the box but also broaden their outlook. The excursion turned out to be an enthralling experience for the young adventurers.







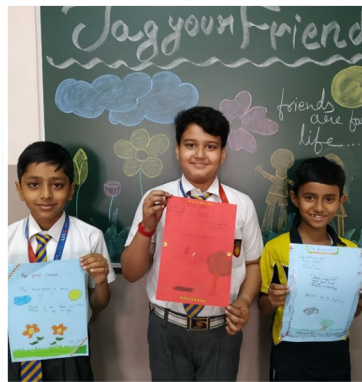

*Fun Activities Post Annual Term-II to V-*

Fun activities Post Annual term can be referred to as a part of a course with an academic curriculum that is offered to mature students as a means of preparing for the intellectual challenges of a new class that awaits them. It can act as supplementary knowledge that can be provided to students to impart basic knowledge in them about the advanced subjects that will be taught to them in the upcoming future. Fun activities Post Annual term will keep the students occupied in their transition from one class to another. In order to assist children in their new educational setting, the primary section of Asian International School had organized Fun activities Post Annual term for the children of classes LKG to



V. In order to help students develop strong social and emotional skills, such as communication or teamwork as they transition to the next grade, many scholastic and Co-scholastic activities were designed by the teachers. The activity team of the primary section came up with many fun-filled sessions to break the monotony of the classroom. Activities related to dance, music, art and craft offered interactive and dynamic learning opportunities that engage students and help them build the skills and knowledge that they need to be successful in life. As music helps students to expand their minds and increase their confidence, activities like musical chair, musical word games were devised. Through dance, students learn teamwork, focus,



and improvisational skills. Therefore, activities like Aerobics and Zumba were taught to children by their dance instructor. Art and craft activities were crafted to reinforce concepts like reasoning, analytical skills, problem-solving skills, addition, removal, measurement, & spatial awareness. Collage making, Fun with DIY etc. were organized to ignite the curiosity of the young minds. Participation in Post excursion Sit n Draw activity allowed students to uncover their natural talents. Apart from these, activities such as Mirror game, Movie time, Dumb charades, Tag your friend etc. helped students to cultivate a broad set of skills and capabilities. Finally it can be said that these activities entail visualizing and accurately depicting objects and concepts, necessitating the use of problem-solving techniques such as analyzing and synthesizing data in a conducive learning environment where students can think more imaginatively and unconventionally.



## CBSE Based Activities



### Special Session on School Health and Wellness- II to V

Physical Education and health education are mutually interdependent. The School Health and Wellness Programme was launched by the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under the aegis of Ayushman Bharat. The program envisages conducting age-appropriate and culturally sensitive prevention and promotion activities in schools to improve the health and well-being of school-going children. In order to impart knowledge according to the CBSE Circular-Acad- 83/2022 on School Health and Wellness Programme, our school had organized sessions in the months of March 2023 that covered a wide range of themes- from growing up healthy to emotional well-being and mental health, Tune into your feelings, Anger Management, Developing Positive Interpersonal Skills, etc. Teachers systematically discussed and analyzed each theme in detail. They were responsible for preparing the session using the appropriate chart, PPT, videos, worksheets, etc to provide accurate and adequate information and inculcate a positive attitude and ability to apply the concerned life skills. The sessions were an insightful learning experience for all. The sessions offered the teachers of the primary classes strategies like yoga and breathing exercises to promote the holistic well-being of the students in their classes. Teachers encouraged their children to identify the causes or triggers for their emotions to gain self-awareness and sustain their emotional health and mental well-being. The sessions facilitated a conducive learning environment for developing essential life skills in all students.





## Vaccination Drive

The Measles and Rubella vaccination drive is a part of global efforts to reduce illness and deaths due to measles and rubella in India. India has already gained significant milestones in the health sector by eradicating several diseases such as polio, smallpox, maternal & neonatal tetanus, etc. Measles claims to kill almost 49000 Indian children annually. On the other hand, Rubella (Congenital Rubella Syndrome or CRS) has caused blindness and irreversible birth defects in children. While there are no treatment options available for both of these diseases, they can be prevented by vaccinations. The Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare is responsible for organizing an ambitious phased vaccination campaign that intends to cover more than 40 Crore children of our country. The government has planned to provide free vaccines to children from the age group of 9 months to 15 years. This is a massive public health movement and is being undertaken through coordinated efforts of the central and state governments, local governments, civil society, and the healthcare workforce. Additionally, it can be said that the National Health Mission of India has tried to identify infected and vulnerable areas through Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) to adopt appropriate strategies to eradicate the disease. Our school had organized a Measles and Rubella vaccination campaign as a preventive measure to inoculate at least 95% of students present in the school. To track the students of a school is easier as they are in a structured environment. Therefore, reports were generated and provided to the District Health Organization. For the execution of the drive, the respected Principal of the school was oriented. The teachers were responsible for orienting the parents regarding the Measles and Rubella vaccination drive through parent-teacher meetings. Such meetings provided a platform to address the queries raised by the parents. On 20th January 2023 a vaccination drive was organized by the Primary Section of Asian International School to provide the preventive booster dose to the children of class LKG to Class V. Teachers were particularly bestowed with the responsibility of conducting the campaign smoothly. The parents were at first taken to the registration room. From there they were redirected to the inoculation area where Health officials gave the shot to the children. Afterward, an edible ink mark was put on the left thumb



for identification as well as confirmation of the booster dose. Each child was handed over the Certificate of vaccination by the class teacher as proof of the same. Finally, reports were prepared by the teachers to keep track of the beneficiaries, and follow-up calls were made to guide the absent students regarding the upcoming MRVC drive.
